## Why SFP?

In Alaska, public school data reported to the U.S. Department of Education that an estimated 3,576 public school students experienced homelessness over the course of the year. Of that total, 333 students were un-sheltered, 646 were in shelters, 186 were in hotels/motels. In 2020, a reported 160 Alaskan families experienced homelessness.

## **The Project**

Safe Families Project is a pilot program designed to address the unmet need of housing for women with children.

The project will focus on meeting the immediate needs of this population by providing housing to parents with their children and addressing the issues that caused their current circumstances.

All program expenses will be at no cost to the parents that are accepted into the project. This includes, but is not limited to, food, clothing, intensive case management, transportation and job preparation.

The Safe Families Project will also assist parents with stable and consistent school and/or childcare.

Graduates of the Safe Families Project will be placed into their own permanent homes with rental/move-in assistance from New Life Development.

### **Program Enrollment Dates**

The Safe Families Project will host three families per quarter. Quarters are as follows:

**Quarter 1: January 1-March 31** 

Quarter 2: April 1- June 30

**Quarter 3: July 1- September 30** 

**Quarter 4: October 1- December 31** 

Applications are due during the month of each quarter.



## **Facility**

New Life Development's Safe Families project main facility is located on the eastside of Anchorage in the Russian Jack Springs neighborhood. New Life facilities are clean and sober and require sobriety throughout the project.

The families will be placed in a fully furnished three- bedroom, 1.5 bathroom shared among the families.

- Free Laundry
- Internet Access
- Satellite Television
- Clothing Voucher
- Bus Passes

## **Program Requirements**

- A mother leaving incarceration, substance misuse treatment, or living in a shelter.
- The program prioritizes
   women with children in OCS
   custody or are fighting for any
   level of participation in their
   children's lives that has been
   disrupted.
- All residents with the ability to seek and gain employment will be required to do so.
- Sobriety is a requirement to be part of the Safe Families Project.
- Attend weekly life skill courses.
- Commit to completing the program.
- Graduation will occur once the project is completed and the family is permanently housed.
